

Greens Committee Meeting

Absence of weeds/dandelions-this is due to a course-wide treatment with a preventative weed application (property line to property line)

Blog – Favorable press thus far. People have enjoyed reading the blog and information. Steve is going to post a new article on how to do ball mark repairs correctly.

Women's issues: The bushes across the street make it difficult to see when pulling out. Steve Kurta is looking into this and also the view from the exit of Tuscarora.

The cup cutting needs to be addressed, the grass around the cups is shaggy. This should improve because the cup cutter is now being sharpened every week as opposed to every three weeks.

The issue of divots and ball marks on greens was presented, and the need for training. Steve is doing an article on how to fix ball marks as a start.

Some of the women's' tee boxes are too far back. This is an issue for women trying to reach the green on the par 3s.

Tree on 1 in front of bunker will be removed; 3 maples will be brought over from 9 o/b line in its place.

There was a discussion on creating communal tees on holes 4/7 and also on 2/17 and 5/14 for the men.

Arborvitae in back of 4th green are going to be removed and possibly replaced with 3 pines from 2 green.

Thin out the pines before 4 green on right, it is getting thick.

Remove arborvitae from women's 5 tee box.

Remove trees near 11 tee box (men)

Batteries – got 4 years instead of 5 out of these. All cart batteries were replaced in the carts this year.

1 tee box – what has the reaction been? No safety issue to date, grass is doing well in absence of bushes, railing/steps to get from practice tee to 1st tee.

Dan Hopkins question: Should we merge blue & black tees to save tee boxes; smaller tee boxes – it will be tried, more seniors are utilizing the silver tees.
